This service is led by a qualified psychologist and is carried out by parishioners who have undergone Diocesan training and who are licensed. This service is available to anyone who needs a listening ear and is experiencing difficulties. This may be a loss of any kind from loss of a job, a relationship, retirement, loss of a loved one, family relationship issues, loneliness, stress, trauma, substance abuse, HIV/AIDS and everything in-between. This service is free of charge and is available by appointment. Emergencies are dealt with as they arise and all discussions are confidential.
